Melbourne too has gained a considerable reputation, but for most The Edinburgh Fringe and Dublin's Fringe and Theatre Festivals are still the barometers. On the evidence of 2012 this would appear to be richly deserved with the bar set incredibly high. In terms of the sheer depth and scope of performances and productions, 2012 was an outstanding year. All of which makes writing a year in review problematic.

A year in review can often sound like the voice of God, surveying with 20-20 vision and speaking with an authority that is as false as it is inaccurate. Looking back to praise the good and the great, so many outstanding productions and performances can fall by the wayside, ignored as if they didn't matter. In truth a few didn't matter. Yet it always needs to be remembed that many shows were not seen and may well have been worthy for inclusion.
